The **Beaford Archive's** iconic black and white photographs of North Devon by James Ravillious and Roger Deakins are familiar to many of us due to their stunning portrayals of a time gone by. Over the past year Beaford Arts has been delving into this collection of over 80,000 images – most of which have never been seen by the public or, for that matter, by the photographers themselves in such detail.

Through their Heritage Lottery Funded project Hidden Histories, Beaford Arts have had the opportunity to, literally, dust off the negatives and find the treasures which are still hidden within the archive. Come and enjoy a selection of unseen photographs taken in and around Hatherleigh, learn more about the ongoing project, and discover the Community Trail we have developed with Hatherleigh Primary School.

34 MARKET STREET


The Workshop Studio is delighted to open its doors over Festival weekend and will be exhibiting and running workshops.

Finish and protect your board with mineral oil (we will explain how to care for your finished piece and give you a small bottle of oil to keep).
